

MILTON E. WADSWORTH AWARD

Guidelines & Procedures

Overview and Eligibility

The Milton E. Wadsworth Award (Wadsworth Award) was established in 1992 and recognizes distinguished contributions that advance our understanding of the science and technology of non-ferrous chemical metallurgy.

Conditions for eligibility are as follows:

1. There are no limitations regarding nationality, race, creed, sex, membership in the society, or otherwise
2. A candidate must be a living person who is able to personally receive the award at the Annual Meeting of the Society for Mining, Metallurgy and Exploration
3. Recipients of other MPD, SME and AIME awards are fully eligible to receive the Milton E. Wadsworth Award
4. Areas eligible for consideration include chemical thermodynamics, phase equilibria, chemical kinetics, transport phenomena, and other phenomena occurring in metallurgical processes such as hydrometallurgy, pyrometallurgy and electrometallurgy.

Timeline

The Wadsworth Award adheres to the following timeline:

Due Date	Task
April 1	Call for nominations
June 1	Nomination deadline
June 30	Committee chair provides qualified applications to members of committee
July 15	First round of voting complete; committee chair schedules conference call to discuss results (if needed)
July 25	Second round of voting complete (if needed)
August 1	Recipient name and citation provided to awards coordinator
September 15	Recipient is notified
SME Annual Meeting	Award is presented

Nominations

Nominations for the Wadsworth Award should contain the following information:

1. Completed nomination form including demographic and contact information for both the nominee and the principal nominator.
2. Up to five letters of support detailing the nominee's qualifications for the award (no longer than 2 pages each).
3. Nominee's biography (2 page maximum).
4. Nominee's CV/resume (abbreviated version – 3 page maximum).
5. List of papers/publications (abbreviated version – 3 page maximum).
6. Appropriate award citation.

All nominations submitted will be considered active nominations for a period of three years. Nominations must be submitted in accordance with the guidelines provided on the award nomination form, which may be downloaded here:

Administration	The Wadsworth Award is administered by the SME Mineral & Metallurgical Processing Division (MPD) Executive Committee. The Wadsworth Award Committee will consist of seven MPD members. Each year two new members shall be appointed for a three-year term, one of whom shall be the most recent Wadsworth Award winner. The Chair shall be appointed for a one-year term from one of the two outgoing members.
Selection of Recipients	Recipients of the Wadsworth Award shall be selected by a majority vote by the Committee of the Award, subject to the approval of the MPD Executive Committee and the SME Board of Directors. The Award need not be presented in any given year if a suitable candidate is not agreed upon.
Award	The Wadsworth Award is a suitable plaque or certificate engraved or embossed with the name of the award as well as the name of the recipient and the citation of the particular achievement for which the award is being conferred.
Presentation of Award	The Wadsworth Award will be presented at MPD's Annual Luncheon, held in conjunction with SME's Annual Meeting. Additionally, the Wadsworth Award recipient will be invited to present a lecture of his/her choice during the MPD Plenary Session.
Funding	All expenses incurred in respect of the Wadsworth Award shall be the financial responsibility of the Mineral & Metallurgical Processing Division.
Amendments	These guidelines may be amended by the Wadsworth Award Committee, subject to approval by the MPD Executive Committee and SME Board of Directors. Any such amendments must be reflected in all appropriate award documentation.
